

Notice of Race

World Laser Masters Championship 2009

27 August 2009 - 5 September 2009

Venue: Nova Scotia, Canada

Organising Authority: Organizing Committee for the 2009 Laser World Championship (Organiser) in Conjunction with the International Laser Class Association (ILCA)

1. RULES

- 1.1. The regatta will be governed by the 'rules' as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS). The prescriptions of the National Authority will not apply.
- 1.2. The Laser class rules Rule 7 (a) is restricted as follows:
Only one person shall be onboard whilst racing. The person shall be named on the entry form.
- 1.3. Add to RRS A11: ARB means scoring penalty after arbitration, PTS scoring penalty for a yellow flag after finish.
- 1.4. Appendix P will apply with P3 amended so that a second and subsequent penalty is not cancelled and P4 amended to also allow redress initiated by the jury.
- 1.5. Advertising - The organizing authority may require competing boats to carry event sponsor advertising on the hull and / or sail.
- 1.6. Sails shall have the full sail number AND NATIONAL LETTERS in accordance with the Class Rules and RRS.

2. ENTRY REGULATIONS

- 2.1. Only current fully paid members of the International Laser Class Association may enter the Championship.
- 2.2. Crew substitution of the registered sailor is not permitted.
- 2.3. No resale of entries or charters will be allowed.
- 2.4. This is an allocated place event. Entry is restricted. Each sailor shall apply using the official online application form (see paragraph 3.2). Places are allocated, after application, by the competitor's National Laser Association.
- 2.5. Each sailor shall be registered as an ISAF Sailor. This information is required to enter the Championship. To register as an ISAF sailor go to: <http://www.isaf.org/isafsailor.php>
- 2.6. Before 27 August 2009 competitors shall be aged:

35 - 44	to enter the Apprentice Laser Standard or Laser Radial Rig categories
45 - 54	to enter the Masters Laser Standard or Laser Radial Rig categories
55 or older	to enter the Grand Masters Laser Standard category
55 - 64	to enter the Grand Master Laser Radial category
65 or older	to enter the Great Grand Masters Laser Radial category

Proof of age will be required at registration
- 2.7. Each competitor shall register on site at the race office before 18:00 29 August 2009.
- 2.8. The total number of entries is restricted to 400 sailors. (Entry limit increased from 350 on 03 Dec 08)

3. ENTRY APPLICATION

- 3.1. Applications for entry will be accepted from 15 September 2008.
- 3.2. Application for an entry shall be made at: <http://events.laserinternational.org/en/events/overview/100z38>
- 3.3. Applications for an entry shall be received by: 23:59 GMT, 13 November 2008.
- 3.4. Applications for an entry will be responded to by 23:59 GMT, 4 December 2008.
- 3.5. Applications that are accepted but that do not receive an initial allocated entry offer will be automatically added to the waiting list for extra places.

4. ENTRY AND ENTRY FEES

- 4.1. The entry fee for this event is £150 GBP.
- 4.2. Entry can only be made once an application has been accepted and full payment of entry fees and the entry form has been completed online using the official entry form.
- 4.3. 50% of entry fees paid are refundable for cancellations received before 23:59 GMT, 24 July 2009.
- 4.4. NO ENTRY FEES ARE REFUNDABLE AFTER 24 July 2009.
- 4.5. Entry opens for initial allocated places: 4 December 2008.
- 4.6. Entry closes for initial allocated places: 23:59 GMT, 16 January 2009.
- 4.7. Extra places will be offered from: 23 January 2009.
- 4.8. Entry closes for extra places: 23:59 GMT, 24 July 2009.
- 4.9. Late entries will only be accepted after 24 July 2009 at the discretion of ILCA upon payment of a late entry fee of £200 GBP (£150 + £50 GBP).

5. PROGRAMME

- 5.1. 27 August 09:00 - 12:00 and 13:00 - 18:00 Registration, Charter Boat allocation
28 August 09:00 - 12:00 and 13:00 - 18:00 Registration, Measurement, Charter Boat allocation
29 August 09:00 - 12:00 and 13:00 - 18:00 Registration, Measurement, Charter Boat allocation followed by an opening reception (buffet meal)
30 August 2 races back to back
31 August 2 races back to back
1 September 2 races back to back
2 September Rest day
3 September 2 races back to back
4 September 2 races back to back, (finals series where applicable)
5 September 2 races back to back, (finals series where applicable) followed by the Prize giving and party (buffet meal).
- 5.2. The time for the first warning signal on the first race day will be: 14:00
5.3. Each day succeeding races will be started as soon as practicable after the finish of the previous race.
5.4. Any race whose warning signal is not given by 16:00 on the last day of the championship will be abandoned and not re-sailed.

6. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Copies of Sailing Instructions will be available from the Race Office during registration.

7. RACE OFFICE

- 7.1. The Race Office is located at: St. Margaret Sailing Club, 5 Foxberry Hill, Glen Haven, NS, B3Z 2W2
7.2. The Race Office is open:
27, 28 & 29 August - 09:00 to 13:00 and 14:00 to 19:00
30 August to 5 September - 09:30 until 30 minutes after the close of the Protest Time unless extended at the discretion of the Race Committee.

8. MEASUREMENT / INSPECTION

- 8.1. Information on measurement will be posted on the official notice board. Boats shall be presented derigged with all equipment that shall be used in the championship.
8.2. Measurement / Inspection will take place at the boat park between the following dates and times:
27, 28 & 29 August - 09:00 to 12:00 and 13:00 to 18:00
8.3. Measurement / Inspection outside these times will only be possible at the discretion of the Regatta Measurer and on payment of \$30 Canadian Dollars.
8.4. Wet clothing, measurement and equipment checks may be made throughout the Regatta at the discretion of the Class Representative, Race Committee or the International Jury.

9. BOATS AND EQUIPMENT

- 9.1. All competitors shall use only one hull, sail, battens, mast, boom, centreboard and rudder all of which shall be identified during measurement/inspection.
9.2. In the event of damage, boats and equipment may only be substituted with the written permission of the Regatta Measurer. If the damage occurs later than 120 minutes before the first scheduled start on a racing day and before the start of the last race of the day, provisional verbal permission shall be obtained from the Jury or Race Committee and the written permission of the Jury or Race Committee shall be applied for before the end of Protest Time at the end of the day in which the substitution takes place.
9.3. Female competitors shall place a red rhombus on each side of their sail (back to back). The rhombi shall be 240mm high and 180mm wide +/- 5mm and shall be located in the centre of the sail immediately above the top batten. 9.4. Boats shall be kept in their assigned places at the venue.
9.5. Boats may be required to display identification numbers.
9.6. Boats may be required to carry cameras, sound equipment or positioning equipment as specified by the organising authority.
9.7. Access to the boat park may be restricted during certain hours including the hours of darkness.

10. TEAM/COACH/SUPPORT BOATS

- 10.1. There will be a Coaches meeting at the Race Office 2.5 hours before the first scheduled start time of the first race each day. The objectives of these meetings are to receive feedback from the coaches on the regatta organisation, exchange view points and inform the coaches about changes in the sailing instructions and regatta organisation in general
10.2. Support boat drivers shall register their boats at the Race Office and submit names and sails numbers of the sailors they are supporting.
10.3. Each coach/support boat shall be clearly identified with a number supplied by the Organising Authority. No other individual support boats shall be used.

- 10.4. Each coach/support boat is recommended to carry a vhf radio capable of transmitting and receiving all international ship to ship channels.
- 10.5. The movements of support boats may be restricted.

11. COURSES

Trapezoid courses will be used with inner and outer loops and an upwind finish. The target time for the first boat in each race will be 60 minutes.

12. INTERNATIONAL JURY

An international jury will be appointed in accordance with rule Appendix N and perform the duties listed in RRS N2.

13. WHISTLE SYSTEM

To encourage boats to take penalties afloat, jury members may blow a whistle when they see what they believe to be a breach of a rule.

14. ALTERNATIVE PENALTIES

For protests where only a rule of Part 2 is alleged to have been broken, an arbitration hearing may be offered prior to any formal protest hearing.

15. APPEALS

There shall be no appeal from the decisions of protests.

16. RADIO COMMUNICATION

A boat shall neither make radio communication while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.

17. DRUG TESTING

- 17.1. Competitors are required to comply with the rule 5 and ISAF Regulation 21, which ban the use of drugs.
- 17.2. Drugs testing may take place during the event.

18. SAFETY

Competitors shall wear a life jacket or other adequate personal buoyancy at all times when afloat. Wet suits and dry suits do not constitute adequate personal buoyancy.

19. SCORING

- 19.1. The Low Point Scoring System of Appendix A will apply.
- 19.2. A total of four races are required to be completed to constitute a championship.
- 19.3. When four to nine races inclusive are completed one race score will be excluded; when ten or more races are completed, two races scores will be excluded.
- 19.4. Men and women competitors from the same category will race together.
- 19.5. The organizers may amalgamate or divide categories into fleets for starting. When a category is divided races will be sailed as a Qualifier series of four days racing followed by a Finals series of two days.
 - 19.5.1. When a category is divided a qualifying race will not count until all qualifying fleets have completed that race.
 - 19.5.2. When a category is divided, if four or more races have been completed one race score will be excluded when calculating the division into the finals fleets.
 - 19.5.3. When a category is divided the qualifying races and final races will count for total points in the championship.
 - 19.5.4. When a category is divided the finals series will start at the end of the fourth racing day providing at least four races are completed. If four races are not completed an additional day will be used for qualifying races. If at the end of an extra day of qualify series racing four races have not been completed then the category will be divided for a finals series with no race scores excluded.
 - 19.5.5. When a category is divided the split for finals race will only be made at the completion of a day's racing.
 - 19.5.6. When a category is divided only one race score may only be excluded from the finals races if at least two finals races are completed.
 - 19.5.7. Laser Standard and Laser Radial categories cannot be amalgamated into a fleet and shall always have separate starts.
 - 19.5.8. Where categories have been amalgamated scoring for each category will be by extraction from the overall results of the fleet without re-scoring.
 - 19.5.9. Where categories have been amalgamated the overall fleet results shall be provided only for information.
- 19.6. The official results shall be published for each of the championship titles listed below.
- 19.7. Results for the women's titles shall be extracted from the overall category position without re-scoring.

- 19.8. If a points scoring penalty for a breach of RRS 42 or under the Arbitration System would result in a score worse than DSQ, the penalty will be that corresponding to DSQ. The scores of other boats will not be changed.

20. PRIZES

- 20.1. Prizes will be awarded in accordance with the ILCA Honour Awards By-Law. Additional prizes may be awarded according to entry numbers for each of the following 11 categories:

- Laser Standard Apprentice Men
- Laser Standard Master Men
- Laser Standard Grand Master Men
- Laser Radial Apprentice Men & Women combined
- Laser Radial Master Men & Women combined
- Laser Radial Grand Master Men & Women combined
- Laser Radial Great Grand Master Men & Women combined
- Laser Radial Apprentice Women
- Laser Radial Master Women
- Laser Radial Grand Master Women
- Laser Radial Great Grand Master Women

21. PHOTOGRAPHY CONSENT

By entering the Championships competitors accept that they may be photographed and/or videotaped participating in the race and/or using the Championship facilities and they consent to the taking of such images and to the use, reuse, publication and republication of such images in any media, in conjunction with the competitors name or not, without compensation and without the competitors approval of such images or any use thereof.

22. LIABILITY

- 22.1. Organiser and ILCA and their officers, members and volunteers do not accept liability for loss of life or property, or personal injury or damage caused by or arising out of the World Laser Masters Championship and competitors take part in the championships at their own risk.
- 22.2. The establishment of the Notice of Race and the Sailing Instructions in no way limits or reduces the complete and unlimited responsibilities of a competitor being solely and entirely responsible for the management of a boat he or she is sailing.
- 22.3. The sailor shall own a boat or have arranged a charter boat and certifies that it is in a safe and seaworthy condition.
- 22.4. A competitor shall be of good health and a competent sailor capable of racing a Laser in open water in 25 knot winds and it is his/her sole responsibility to decide to participate in a race or to continue racing.
- 22.5. It is the responsibility of each sailor to decide to participate in a race or to continue racing.
- 22.6. The participating boat is required to hold adequate insurance and in particular to hold insurance against third party claims of at least \$1,000,000 CAD (1 million Canadian Dollars).
- 22.7. A competitor is recommended to have personal accident and health insurance that covers them while attending the regatta and whilst racing.

23. INDEMNIFICATION

To the fullest extent permitted by law, each competitor agrees to indemnify and hold the International Laser Class Association and the Organizing Committee for the 2009 Laser World Championships, owners, affiliates, officers, employees, agents, committee persons and race officials acting in their official capacities harmless, from any third party claim to the extent arising from a competitor's acts or omissions.
